
Getting Ready for a Multivisceral Transplant Book







You may have heard that your liver and intestines are sick or aren't working how they're supposed to.

Your liver and intestines job are to clean your blood, store vitamins and energy, and produce bile to help digest food.





When your liver and intestines are sick, they have a hard time doing their jobs. Your doctors might try some medicine to help your liver and intestines. If the medicine doesn't help, a multivisceral transplant might be the best way to help your body feel better.

Do you know what a multivisceral transplant is?




A multivisceral transplant is a surgery where doctors give your body a new liver and intestines.

Your doctors want to be sure that your new liver and intestines will be the best ones for your body. It might take your doctors a long time to find the right liver or intestines for you.

That is OK.

The doctors will call ____ when they have found your new liver and intestines.









When you arrive at the hospital for your multivisceral transplant, you will go to the Hale building and take the elevator to the 10th floor.

This is the part of the hospital where doctors help kids when their liver and intestines are sick.

Your room might look like this!

You will meet a nurse when you get to your room. The nurse will help you get ready for your transplant surgery.







You might have to wait many hours until it's time for your transplant. You can ask a Child Life Specialist for toys, activities or games to play while you are waiting.

There will be a team of people taking care of you at the hospital. Before your transplant your team will come see you. They will tell you about how they will help take care of you and ask you and many of the same questions.

That is OK.

They ask questions because we use teamwork at the hospital!






Your team will let you know what you need to do to get ready for your transplant. It's important to stop eating or drinking before your surgery. Sometimes your team will ask you to stop eating and drinking when they have found your new liver and intestines. This helps your body get ready for surgery.

You will be asleep for your transplant surgery. The doctors will give you special sleep medicine. They might give you the medicine through a mask or through an IV.




An IV is a small straw that gives your body medicine or water.






might have a lot of machines. The machines are there to keep your body safe. _____ will also be there when you wake up!



You will wake up with some new tubes. **That is OK!**They are there to help your body. Your team will tell you when it's time for these tubes to come out. You will also have a Band-Aid like this on your belly where the doctors placed your new liver and intestines.



You may have to stay in the hospital for a while after you get your multivisceral transplant. This is so your team can take care of you as your body heals.



You will also need to wear a mask after your transplant when you are around other people. Wearing a mask will help protect your body and new liver and intestines from germs.



There are so many fun things to do at the hospital. You can play games, create art or go to the playroom. You can also meet a Music Therapist!



When your team says your body is ready, it will be time to leave the hospital. Everyone will be so proud of you!
