AbbVie CF Scholarship for Higher Education:

Designed for students with CF pursuing an undergraduate degree (Associate's/2-year college, Bachelor's/4-year college, trade/vocational school) or graduate degree (Master's, M.D., J.D., doctorate). Applicants must have completed high school or obtained a General Educational Development (GED) certification on or before June. Each year, AbbVie awards 40 scholars with \$3,000 each. Two of these students are then selected to receive a Thriving Student Scholarship, winning an additional \$22,000 each.

Coach-Ed Academic Scholarship

Coach-Ed provides academic scholarships of up to \$1,000 per semester/\$2,000 per academic year to qualified students with cystic fibrosis to attend accredited four-year college programs. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis, but must be received at least 2 months prior to the beginning of the next semester. Scholarships may be renewed, but students must reapply each academic year and must provide transcripts.

Bowman Brothers Trade Scholarship

This scholarship opportunity is open to adults (18+) living with cystic fibrosis who will be attending a *trade school*. People must complete the application found on the website. The finalists will be reviewed by the ROCK CF Committee on financial need and the application essay. Finalists will complete a phone interview as a follow-up to their essay.

US Adult Cystic Fibrosis Association (USACFA) Scholarships

USACFA offers scholarships for people with CF who are seeking *artistic and/or educational degrees*. These scholarships are paid to the bursar's office at the winner's institution and covers any costs paid through that office. You will not receive more than one scholarship per academic year, but you may apply for more than one scholarship in an academic year.

<u>Higher Education Scholarship in Memory of Lauren Melissa Kelly</u>: The academic scholarships of up to \$2500 are awarded to two adults with cystic fibrosis who are pursuing career certifications, associates, and bachelor and graduate degrees.

Scholarship for the Arts in Memory of Helen M. Eisenman: This scholarship will award two deserving students **\$5,000** each towards their tuition in their respective *field of the arts:* fine arts, computer graphics, design, music, choral, photography, filmmaking, creative writing, and poetry, to name a few. It is open to anyone seeking a degree, from an associate to a doctoral degree in the *creative arts*.

<u>The William Coon, Jr. Scholarship:</u> This scholarship will award 20 scholarships, valued at \$2,500 each. Four scholarships will be awarded per academic year for five consecutive years. Any student with CF seeking a degree in any of the following is welcome to apply: *business, economics, communications, political science, information, project management, finance, accounting, public administration, or marketing.*

<u>The Stenzel Scholarship</u>: The Ana and Isa Stenzel Scholarship is a \$2,500 scholarship that may be awarded once annually to a person with cystic fibrosis who is, during the period for which the scholarship award is paid, enrolled in a course of higher education leading to a degree granted by an institution in the United States in either *health science*, social work, mental health science, genetic counseling, or environmental science.

Student must be in good academic standing (not on academic warning/probation) with a GPA of 2.0 or higher at time of application. Scholarships are awarded in amounts **up to \$2500** and you must apply each semester. Scholarships are based on financial need. Application can be submitted online, or via paper application sent by mail.

Scholarships for Those Living with a Chronic Illness/Disability

Patient Advocate Foundation's Survivor Scholarship (Undergraduate & Graduate)

Undergraduate students must be under age 25, a full-time student, and have been diagnosed and/or actively treated for cancer or chronic illness in the past 5 years. The undergraduate award is \$3,000 per academic year, or a total of \$12,000. *Graduate* students must have been diagnosed and/or been actively treated for cancer or chronic illness is the past 10 years. The graduate award is \$3,000 per academic year, or a total of \$6,000. Scholarship recipients must agree to complete 20 hours of community service and maintain a certain GPA. #RAREis Scholarship Fund

EveryLife Foundation for Rare Diseases established the #RAREis Scholarship Fund – to enrich the lives of adults living with rare diseases. One-time awards of \$5,000 each will be granted for the Fall semester. Applicants must be 17yo or older, living in the US, with a plan to enroll full-time or part-time in undergraduate or graduate study at an accredited *two- or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical/trade school* for the Fall semester. Students are also able to take *non-traditional classes*, such as photography or art classes, as long as they are accredited. A single class is included under the definition of "part-time" status and do not need to be pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree. As of 2024, the lifetime limit to receive the scholarship is 4 times.
