What to expect

If your child is here for observation

Tumor monitoring typically involves periodic MRI scans, with the frequency tailored to factors like tumor type, location, and treatment plan. Scan intervals can vary from every few months for aggressive tumors to annually for stable ones. These scans help assess your child's response to treatment and detect any changes, guiding adjustments to the treatment plan as necessary.


If your child is here for surgery

- Once you meet with your child's surgeon to review imaging scans and discuss the surgery plan, you'll schedule a pre-operative clinic appointment for lab work and an anesthesia evaluation.
- While your child is recovering from surgery, you may meet
 other members of the Brain Tumor Center team, such as neuro oncologists, neurologists, ophthalmologists, and endocrinologists.
 We'll set up the appropriate next steps in your child's care plan as
 we review the pathology and MRI results.
- We'll schedule a post-operative appointment with a Brain Tumor
 Center nurse practitioner for approximately four weeks after
 surgery, as well as additional subspecialty appointments as directed.
- We'll give you contact numbers before you leave in case you need to reach us before your post-op visit.

If your child is here for treatment

Every journey through brain tumor treatment is different and is individualized to your child's needs. Your child's care team is dedicated to helping you navigate these options. We understand the importance of minimizing side effects and maximizing effectiveness, and we will work closely with you to address any concerns and answer any questions you may have along the way. Common treatment options include surgery, chemotherapy (with or without stem cell transplant), radiation therapy, targeted inhibitor therapy, and possibly a clinical trial. We offer these approaches through the Brain Tumor Center.

Support services

The <u>Hale Family Center for Families</u> supports patient families throughout your experience at Boston Children's. The Center is located in the main lobby of Boston Children's at 300 Longwood Avenue in Boston and offers resources such as:
